Meeting September 9, 2010

The Board met on September 9 in Vancouver to consider the final program review report from the site visit to the Faculty of Forestry, University of Moncton, in Edmundston, New Brunswick in March 2010. Accreditation for a period of three years was granted to the Forestry Sciences Program. The accreditation period begins with the 2010/2011 academic year and continues to June 30, 2013, or for as long as the subject program is in place, whichever is of shorter duration. The University of Moncton program was the second to be reviewed using the new, competency-based academic standards of the CFAB (November 24, 2008).

Dr. Steve Mitchell, Associate Professor, UBC gave a presentation on the status of the development of a Masters in Forestry program at the school. The program aims to meet the requirements for professional certification and for CFAB accreditation.

The next meeting of the Board will be held in Quebec City during September 2011. [November, 2010]
