Notes:

1. Graduates of the base Forestry Program during this accreditation period may, or may not, have received accreditation-required instruction in **forest entomology, forest pathology, forest harvesting, wood science and utilization**. Graduates from the Program major were required to take these subjects. CFPFA member agencies were advised and will need to review the credentials of applicants from the base program to determine if these subjects have been taken. Subsequent program accreditations do not carry this caveat
2. Although few do not take the course, graduates of the Forest Business Management Program may have elected to not take the program's capstone **Integrated Forest Management** instruction. CFPFA member agencies have been alerted to this and have been cautioned to determine if the course of instruction has indeed been taken when a graduate of the program from this accreditation period applies for professional membership. For accreditation purposes, the academic credentials of those who have not taken the course should be deemed inadequate in the noted subject area.
3. Against the academic standards for accreditation, the base Forest Engineering Program was deemed to have inadequate instruction in **forest ecology, forest entomology, forest pathology, forest fire management and tree physiology**. As a result, graduates from the base program should be deemed to have not graduated from an accredited program. The program, including the R.P.F. option, was terminated at the end of the 2012/13 academic year.
